## Staff Submission to 2009/19 Draft Long Term Council Community Plan

### **New matters for consideration**

Since the publication of the draft Long Term Council Community Plan (LTCCP) the following issues have arisen:

#### **1. Participation by Westland in the proposed National Cycleway.**

At the June Council meeting, it was resolved to amend the Westland Nature Trust Deed to enable the District to fully benefit from the proposed national cycleway.

The following changes are required to the adopted LTCCP to reflect this new activity.

##### **a. In the Introduction from the Mayor and Chief Executive add in:**

Westland is joining with Buller and Grey Districts to create a series of cycleways which will form part of the proposed national cycleway. The Westland Nature Trust will be re-established, with new objectives to assist in achieving this. This is an exciting opportunity to share in central government funding of \$50m to create the cycleways which will become important tourist attractions.

##### **b. In the transportation section "Where do we want to be?" on page 123 add in:**

Have a nationally recognised cycleway which is safe and well used by both tourists and locals.

##### **c. In the transportation section "How are we going to get there?" on page 123 add in:**

Council will work with Buller and Grey Districts to apply for funding to develop cycleways which will form part of a national cycleway.

- d. In the financial information on pages 123 and 127 add in capital expenditure of \$3.2 million, to be spread over 2009/10 to 20011/12 for the development of cycleways. Income for this activity to be Government subsidy \$3m; sale of land (road reserve) \$0.1m; and reserves contribution \$0.1m
