



## Cardboard Recycling

You can recycle **FLATTENED AND TIED** cardboard  
*Place on the kerbside beside your normal weekly council rubbish bag.*

### Corrugated cardboard :

- This is the rippled cardboard used for large cardboard boxes.
- Flatten and tie into bundles. Health and safety issues have made it important that corrugated cardboard is flattened and tied in bundles **no larger than 50 cm by 50 cm.**

### Cardboard and boxboard :

- This is the clean thin cardboard used for packets
- The boxes must be **clean** and **empty**.
- Remove any plastic inner bag or lining.
- Undo the side and bottom flaps and flatten the cardboard cartons, boxes - then tie in bundles.

Please make sure that no cardboard is waxed, lined with plastic or foil or has been contaminated with food scraps.

## Paper Recycling

You can recycle all **clean dry paper, in a reused shopping bag**. *Place on the kerbside beside your normal weekly council rubbish bag.*

- Place all clean paper, office paper, newspaper, circulars, magazines, glossies/brochures into a plastic shopping bag.
- Tie the handles tightly together to completely cover the paper.

This keeps it **SECURE** and **DRY**

- Try not to overfill the bags to prevent rain from getting inside the bag.

We **CANNOT** recycle **WET PAPER**

- Place your plastic shopping bag containing the paper on the kerbside **NEXT** to your council rubbish bag.

### Old Telephone Books

Rip the covers off the telephone book and dispose of them in your rubbish. Put the rest of the old book with your other paper for recycling.
